The United World Colleges (UWC) Movement

UWC is a network of 18 internationally recognised schools. National Committees in over 155 countries select students based on merit, offering an educational experience that combines academic excellence with personal challenges, while promoting values such as inclusion, acceptance, and respect for others.

UWC's mission is to make education a **force for uniting people and cultures**, guiding students to become **active**, **aware**, **resourceful**, **and critical-thinking citizens** through a high-level academic programme. Diversity is at the core of the UWC experience, extending beyond nationality to **socioeconomic**, **cultural**, **ethnic**, **and religious backgrounds**.

Studying in this environment offers a unique opportunity for personal and intellectual growth, providing students with a globally recognised qualification while fostering crucial leadership skills for today's complex world.

Candidate Profile

The ideal candidate is **responsible**, **open-minded**, **and academically capable**, with a strong sense of **empathy**, **tolerance**, **and understanding of different perspectives**. Given the intensity of the UWC experience, candidates should demonstrate **emotional resilience**, **stability**, **and the ability to manage academic and extracurricular challenges away from their family environment**.

Candidates may be asked to undergo an **interview with a counsellor or psychologist** during or after the selection process to assess these competencies further.

Academic Courses and Co-Curricular Activities at UWC

All UWC schools follow a **two-year programme** covering the final years of secondary school, culminating in the **International Baccalaureate (IB) Diploma**, recognised worldwide.

Each student's **individual study plan** includes six subjects, selected from at least five of the six IB subject groups. **At least three subjects must be studied at a higher level (HL), while the others are at a standard level (SL).**

Additionally, students must:



- Complete a **Theory of Knowledge (ToK)** interdisciplinary course
- Submit an **Extended Essay** in one of their subjects
- Engage in Creativity, Activity, and Service (CAS) projects
- Participate in a **sport**
- Pursue a creative or artistic activity

English is the language of instruction at all UWC colleges, with **initial language support available** if necessary. **English proficiency is not an evaluation criterion for selection.**

Purpose of the Call for Applications

The Italian National Committee for UWC is offering a competition for admission to UWC Adriatic for the 2025-27 biennium, specifically for foreign students who entered Italy as unaccompanied minors and are legally residing in the country.

UWC Adriatic normally admits students aged 16 to 19.

Scholarships Available for 2025/2027

UWC seeks to ensure that financial constraints do not prevent any selected student from attending.

For foreign students who entered Italy as unaccompanied minors, **two full scholarships are currently available**, provided thanks to support by **Fondazione De Agostini** and **Assicurazioni Generali**. Additional scholarships may become available during or after the selection process.

The scholarship covers:

- All school-related expenses, including books and learning materials
- Costs associated with CAS (Creativity, Activity, and Service) projects
- Full room and board at UWC Adriatic for two years
- International Baccalaureate (IB) examination fees

UWC Adriatic is a **boarding school in Duino (TS)**, hosting around **200 students from over 80 countries**.



Selection Criteria

Applicants will be assessed based on:

- Intellectual curiosity and general knowledge, with a focus on contemporary issues
- Ability to think critically and independently
- Teamwork and collaboration skills
- Altruism, willingness to share experiences and passions
- Motivation to join UWC and commitment to its values

Eligibility Requirements

Applicants must:

- Be between 16 and 19 years old
- Have entered Italy as unaccompanied foreign minors and hold valid residence permits
- Be enrolled in the third or fourth year of an Italian secondary school
- Alternatively, they must demonstrate at least 10 years of formal education, even across different countries

In special cases, the Italian National Committee reserves the right to evaluate individual applications even if documentation is incomplete.

Required Documentation and Submission Guidelines

Applicants must submit:

- 1. **A completed application form** (attached to the call for applications), filled in **Italian**, **French**, **or English** and signed by their legal guardian
- 2. A copy of the applicant's identity document
- 3. A copy of the guardian's identity document
- 4. A copy of the Italian residence permit (or proof of application)
- Academic transcripts for 2023-24 or documentation proving at least 10 years of education
- 6. **A passport or travel document**, if available
- 7. **A reference letter** from a teacher, educator, or tutor detailing the applicant's academic and extracurricular strengths



8. **A one-minute motivational video**, where the applicant explains why they want to attend UWC Adriatic.

All documents must be sent in a single email with the subject:

Selection Process

The Italian National Committee will oversee the **selection process**, with organisational support from **UWC Adriatic O.N.L.U.S.**

Candidates will complete:

- Written tests (general knowledge and logical-mathematical reasoning)
- A motivational and general knowledge interview
- Group activities

Interviews can be conducted in **Italian, English, French, or Arabic**, depending on the candidate's preference.

A final ranking will be compiled based on **overall performance**, and selection decisions **cannot be appealed**. The **final admission decision** rests with the **Rector of UWC Adriatic**.

Selection Dates

Applicants will receive confirmation of selection by Wednesday, 2 April 2025.

The selection day will take place on Saturday, 12 April 2025, from 9:00 AM to 6:00 PM in Rome, at the Friuli Venezia Giulia Regional Office (Piazza Colonna, 355).

Results will be announced by Wednesday, 7 May 2025 via email.

If financial difficulties prevent an applicant from travelling to Rome, they may request financial support for travel and accommodation by emailing cniuwc@it.uwc.org as soon as possible.
